The Mission of God, of the Church, and of Your Life

John 3:16

God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believes in him shall not perish, but have everlasting life.

1 Corinthians 15:55-56 — "Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting? The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. But thanks be to God, who gives victory through our Lord Jesus Christ!"

When you understand the Lamb of God was sacrificed for you, the cross was about rescuing you from the dominion of lostness and death, then you can come to life as John 3:16 describes.
